

Why the Book of Enoch is False?

1. In the Book of Enoch, Enoch was described that he had **visited heaven** and receiving revelations. He is one of two only two people who have never tasted death after ~~3333~~ took them (Enoch & Elijah), like what the book of Genesis 5:24 said. During his visit to heaven ~~3333~~ showed him the prophetic visions of a future messiah. According to The Parables of Enoch (1 Enoch 37-71) which is a different book, Enoch saw what was concerning an eschatological hero known as the "Son of Man." This figure is also called the "Chosen One," the "Anointed," and the "Righteous One," which are all titles referring to the same Messianic figure in the narrative. During his visit to heaven, he is shown prophetic visions of this future messiah. He is told that this figure will be a light to the nations, all will worship him, and the righteous will have salvation in his name. Does that sound like Jesus Christ who many claimed him about? While there are others who say this messianic character is not Jesus, it is Enoch, which puts the writings in conflict with Biblical teachings.

Let's say this book is actually talking about Jesus, this would be the first major problem right away. Because this Jesus which the New Testament books talk about is actually a false Messiah. If we already know that the New Testament Bible is a false doctrine book, therefore the book of Enoch is also false.

2. The Book of Enoch talks about Genesis chapter 6 "sons of God" who took wives from among the "daughters of man" in 1st Enoch. Telling us that these "sons of God" were angels, known as Watchers, led by the angel Semjâzâ, the Ethiopic version of the name Samael. It said that these fallen angels taught the human women the forbidden arts, such as magic spells and enchantments, making weapons and waging war, astrology, a love for earthly delights such as jewelry and other ornaments, and—perhaps the vilest of all—cosmetology.

This Genesis chapter 6 "**sons of God**" which the book of Enoch says cannot be true. For one thing, the author who wrote the book somehow was either doing it on purpose or was blind to see who were these "**sons**" in chapter 6. That this "sons" was actually referring to the Nephilim people, the normal human being. They are not in any way the evil spiritual messengers (fallen Angels) at all. Mainly, the spiritual messenger (Angel) is never called a "SON". Only mankind is being called "son".

3. According to 1 Enoch, this book describes by the Watchers, fallen angels who mated with human women and produced offspring—the Nephilim as "great giants, whose height was three thousand **ells**." (An **ell is an old measurement equal to about 45 inches**, so these giants were about 11,250 feet, or just over two miles, tall???) The book of Enoch is not the only source that speaks about Nephilim, for example, in The Book of Giants, one of the Dead Sea Scrolls also spoke about Enoch and these strange rock giants also mentioned the same description of height. While this book of Enoch goes on to say that the Watchers, the fallen angels, or Nephilim as "great giants later ate up all the regular humans for food is all such odd.

Generally, I've already mentioned in #2 that only mankind is being called "son". The spiritual messenger (Angel) of ~~3333~~ is no son. And secondly, nowhere in the Old Testament books did it mention that the Nephilim people were also called the Watchers. Third, the Nephilim were giant people, yes, but they were not as tall as 1,250 feet LOL. I have a reason to believe they were between 9 to 18 or 20 ft tall.

4. The book of Enoch spoke about what the Earth looks like. He claimed that the Earth is a flat planet with a dome of firmament over it. But I, disagree with this for a number of reasons.

5. It Odd story about a born baby's eyes shot out with a solar beam, like Superman. The story goes that when Enoch's grandson Lamech and his wife gave birth, the baby was "white as snow and red as the blooming of a rose, and the hair of his head and his long locks were white as wool, and his eyes beautiful." The problem with those beautiful eyes is when he opened them, solar beams shot out of them, filling the whole house with sunlight and blinding everyone inside. At this point, the baby Noah stood up in the midwife's arms and began talking to God. Lamech, understandably terrified, runs to his father Methuselah, and tells him he's worried his wife accidentally gave birth to some kind of angel baby—another strange odd story.

6. The book of Enoch spoke about what the heavens look like. This book mentioned hell in heaven - 2 Enoch, chapter 3??? UH?

7. ~~3 Enoch~~ changed Enoch into a different not normal form of person? According to 3 Enoch, chapter 9, once Enoch was raised to Heaven, God turned him into a kind of super-angel, "the size of the length and width of the world," with "72 wings ... 36 on each side," and "365 eyes [and] each eye was as the great luminary." Metatron sits on a throne next to God and serves as "God's representative and ruler over all the princes of kingdoms and all the children of heaven." God crowns him and calls him "the lesser ~~3 Enoch~~." Also, his skin is flames, his bones are coal, his eyelashes are lightning, and his eyeballs are burning firebrands—quite an upgrade for old Enoch.

Bottom line here, this Genesis Enoch is not the man of what 1st, 2nd, or 3rd books of Enoch speak of at all. Like all of those 7 example explains to us the reason why the Book of Enoch is a fake.
